The Euclid City Schools

The Euclid City Schools include an Early Learning Village, four elementary schools, a secondary middle and high school campus, an Educational Options Center, and a social developmental center managed by Chancelight Behavioral Health. The buildings' expanse is nearly 1.5 million square feet of indoor space with beautifully maintained large campuses with room to roam. Very few school districts can find the resources available to maximize student growth and achievement. Below is just a snippet of all Euclid has to offer.

The award-winning 5-Star Step Up to Quality Early Learning Village opened in 2019 and is home to our preschool and kindergarten programs. The building design lends itself to unique programming opportunities. Complimenting the 35 classrooms includes a media center and a FAB Lab designed to engage and inspire imagination in our youngest, most impressionable learners through STEM programming. The facility has two gymnasiums, an auditorium, a cafeteria and a music wing. Kindergarten is an all-day program, while there is a morning session and afternoon session for pre-school children. Our four elementary schools are special places that educate students in grades 1-5. We have a capacity of roughly 600 students per building. At our elementary schools, each of our families becomes family. We take pride in our community outreach and strong relationships with our community partners. We provide programming for families, support for students and so much more. Our students are not only acknowledged for their outstanding academic achievements but also their personal accomplishments. The State of Ohio recognizes us for our commitment to our students. At each of our elementary schools, students are provided with experiential learning, having the opportunities to explore beyond the four walls to make learning more relevant and meaningful. Our schools have been recognized with the following honors; High Progress School of Honor by the Ohio Department of Education, the Silver Recognition from the State for our work with Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports, and the Momentum Award for exceeding expectations in student growth awarded by the State of Ohio. The Euclid Middle School, located on the secondary campus complex, is the educational home to roughly 1,100 students. Students in grades 6 - 8 benefit from the proliferation of Positive Behavior Intervention Supports. Advanced students have the opportunity to participate in high school courses with the high school on the same campus. Team teaching is the approach in the building, which is custom-designed to accommodate the team teaching structure. The community environment consists of 123 students per area, allowing for meaningful relationship-building and student/teacher interaction. Students attending Euclid Middle School have access to extracurricular programs, music and performing arts programs, student government and peer-based support groups. Students in the middle school and high school are also issued a

Euclid High School partners with Euclid Middle School to complete the Secondary Campus. The high school offers over 100 learning spaces to engage nearly 2,000 students in impactful programming. The school has two gyms, access to the middle school field house, three turf fields, an indoor swimming pool, a planetarium, newly renovated large and small auditoriums, indoor and outdoor track facilities and a Career Tech wing that is the envy of other schools and manufacturing plants in the area. The high school engages in meaningful partnerships with local businesses, Cuyahoga Community College, support groups that include Open Doors Academy, the Boy's and Girl's Club, the Cleveland Browns and Chancelight Behavioral Health Services. The new campus is hopping with activity daily and is intended to serve as an 18-hour resource for our students and community.

Euclid is an established lakefront community 11 miles northeast of Cleveland, Ohio. Euclid is home to 48,920 residents who live, play and work within the 10.3 square miles of land highlighted by nearly 4 miles of lakefront property. Euclid is a manufacturing-based community with 150 companies producing machinery, aerospace, automotive, electrical, welding, and machined parts. Two daily newspapers, the News Herald and the Cleveland Plain Dealer serve as the source of current events. They are supplemented by a monthly edition of the local Euclid Observer.

The world-renowned Cleveland Clinic services the health needs of the residents with the Cleveland Clinic Euclid Hospital. Cleveland Clinic's main campus is less than 10 miles away, with University Hospitals and the Metro Healthcare Campus also nearby. The Regional Transit Authority provides transportation in and around Cuyahoga County with dozens of depot stops in Euclid. Just a hop, skip and jump away in Cleveland are professional sports teams, a thriving, diverse downtown, museums, botanical gardens, dinner cruise ships, and the Cleveland Playhouse Square theater district that is second to none.

Euclid's recreation opportunities are numerous. Memorial Park boasts 55 acres in the city's center, featuring a lighted sports area, sand volleyball, baseball, soccer, basketball, tennis courts, pickleball courts, walking and biking paths, picnic areas, a playground, pool, and an enclosed ice arena. Euclid is also home to Briardale Golf Course, an 18-hole regulation course on 126 acres; 6,274 yards, par 70. Sims Park, a lakefront public space, offers 33.5 acres (800' beachfront), a playground, picnic area, amphitheater, disc golf, and an activity center. The Cleveland Metroparks operate Euclid Creek Reservation in the southern part of the city, with 233 acres of nature walks, biking, picnic areas and other recreational opportunities.
